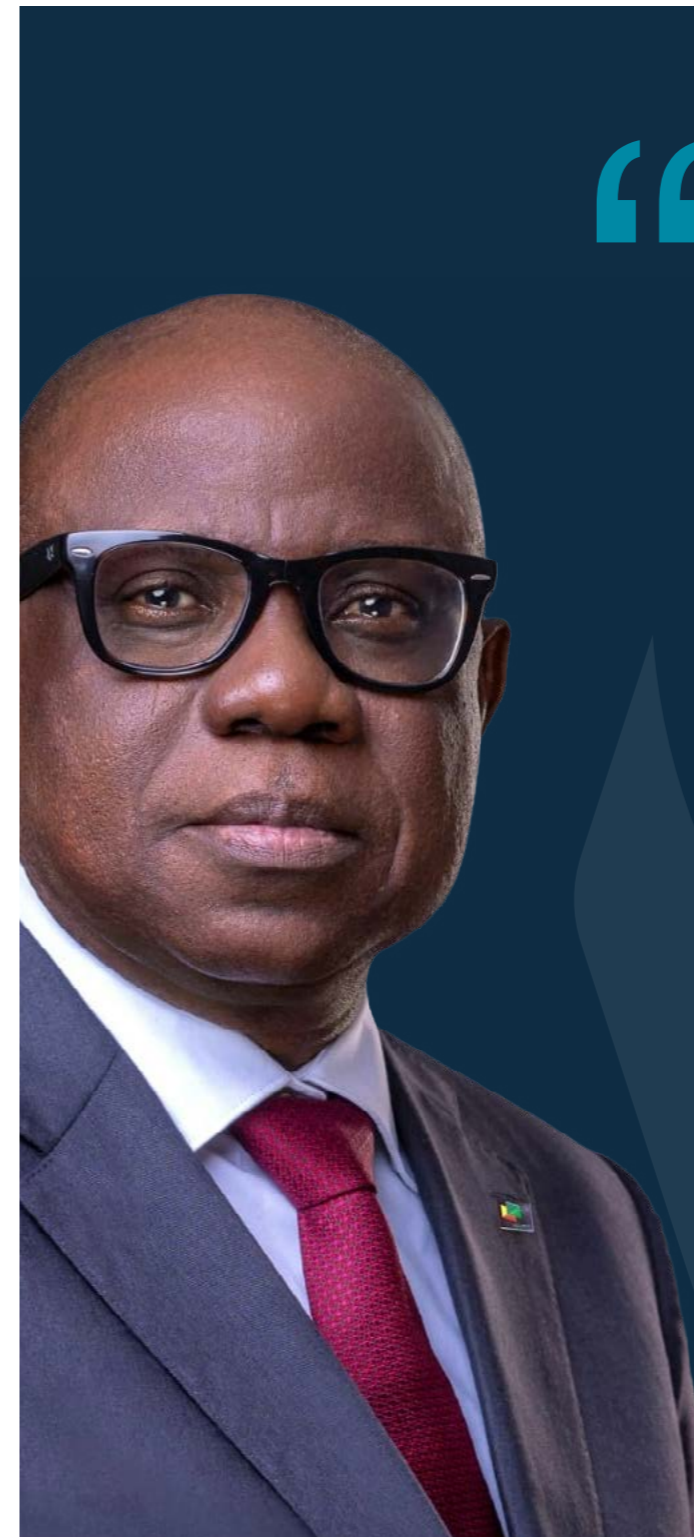

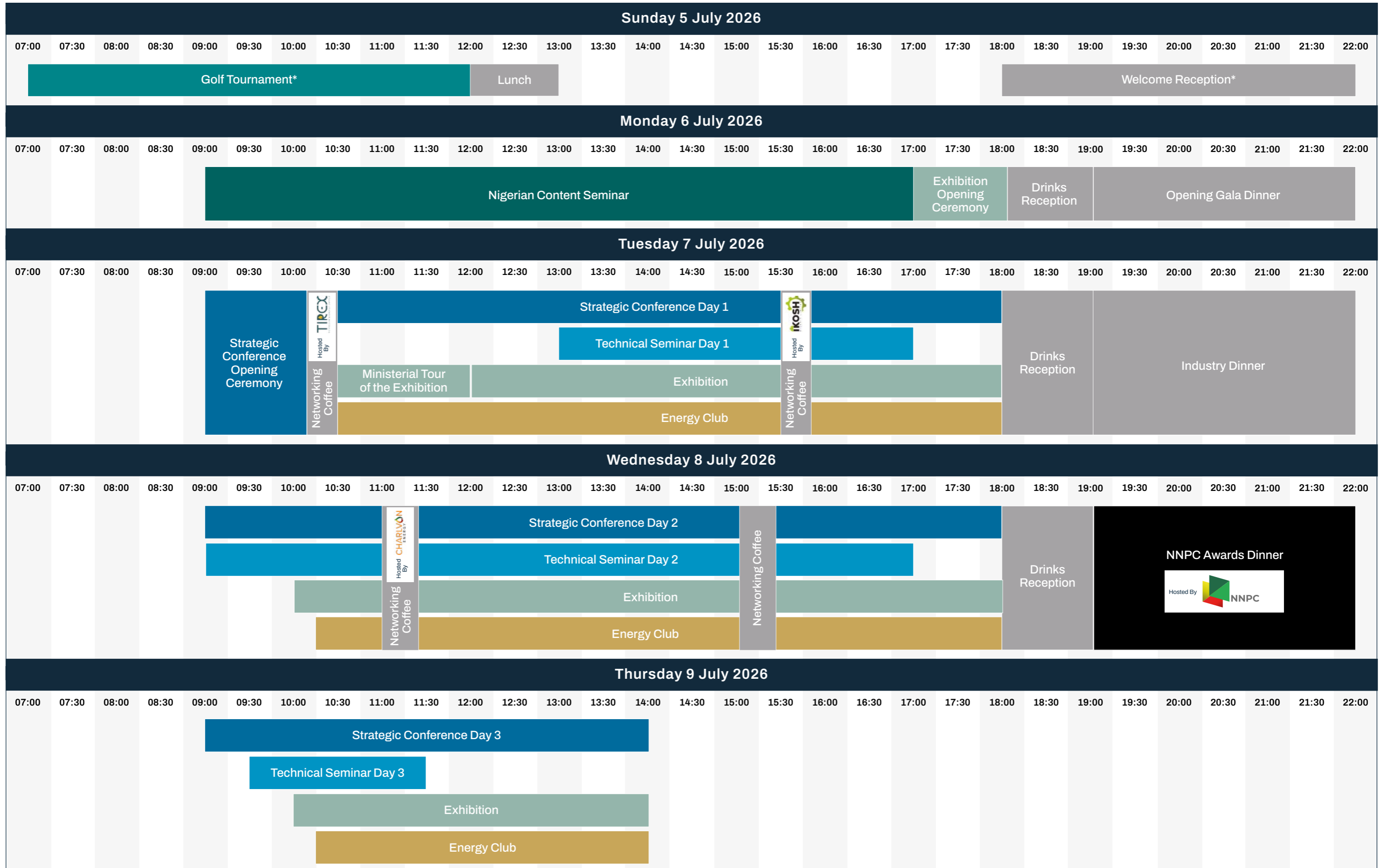

## Nigerian Content Seminar

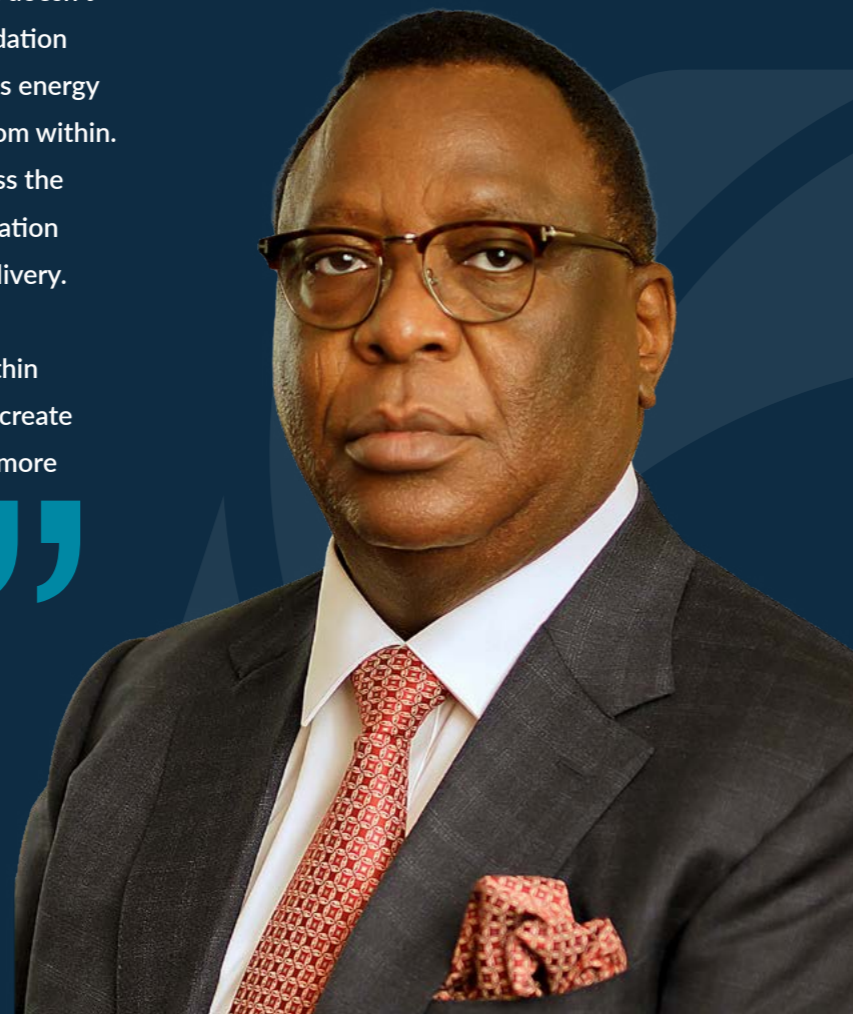

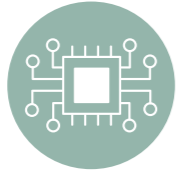

Connecting West African gas resources to regional markets and beyond the project reflects a broader vision of continental cooperation, shared infrastructure and coordinated investment designed to unlock Africa's vast gas potential and support long-term industrial growth.</p> <p>Launched in 2016 with a budget of \$20–25 billion, this ambitious project is more than infrastructure, it's a lifeline for economic development, industrialisation and regional energy security. How has the project evolved since its initial conception and where does development currently stand? What lessons has the development process revealed about delivering large-scale energy infrastructure across Africa? 16:00 - 16:30 **Energy Talk: Accelerating the FLNG Frontier**



Floating LNG (FLNG) is rapidly emerging as a key solution for accelerating gas development, enabling producers to monetise offshore resources while reducing exposure to onshore infrastructure, security and permitting risks. As Africa prepares for a significant rise in gas demand, projected to increase by around 60% by 2050, this infrastructure offers a faster and more flexible pathway to market.

Across the continent, projects in Mozambique and Congo have demonstrated how FLNG can unlock offshore reserves and fast-track LNG exports. With more than 200 trillion cubic feet of proven gas reserves, Nigeria is well positioned to leverage this model to expand LNG capacity and strengthen its role in global gas markets. Yet despite several proposed projects, progress has been slower than in other African markets. What conditions are required for Nigeria to compete effectively in the FLNG market? And what lessons from existing projects can help unlock Nigeria's abundant offshore gas resources?

Across Africa, gas consumption remains heavily concentrated in electricity generation with about 48.6% being used for electricity generation and only 17.4% for industrial use. Globally, however, gas plays a far broader role as a foundation for industrial development, serving as a critical feedstock for fertiliser, petrochemicals, refining, cement, steel and manufacturing.

Expanding the role of gas across industry presents an opportunity to accelerate industrialisation, strengthen domestic value chains and support long-term economic growth. As demand for industrial materials, fertiliser and chemicals continues to rise, unlocking the full value of gas resources will depend on increasing supply, developing supporting infrastructure and attracting the investment required to support gas-based industries at scale.

What is required to unlock gas for industrial development? And how can infrastructure, pricing frameworks and policy alignment support the creation of competitive gas-based industrial hubs?

The recent wave of investments by international oil companies into Nigeria's deepwater upstream fields signals renewed confidence in the country's petroleum sector. Yet the critical question remains: *what next?*

While capital inflows are encouraging, the sustainability of these investments hinges on how effectively Nigeria implements the fiscal incentives embedded in the Petroleum Industry Act (PIA) and the strategies to embed the intentions of the Presidential directives to create stability required to realise the benefits of long-term investments.

How will the risks around low and regulated gas pricing be mitigated to secure the viability and profitability of gas projects – to realise the potentials of Nigeria's transition fuel? Furthermore, local content requirements have expose gaps in local capacity and capability in operating in the deep offshore space, raising questions about whether Nigeria can balance national participation goals with the operational demands of complex deepwater projects.

12:30 - 13:00 Energy Talk: Powering the AI Economy: Is Nigeria Ready for the Next Digital Frontier?



The rapid expansion of AI, cloud computing and digital services is driving an unprecedented global surge in data centre development. As governments and technology firms race to secure computing capacity, energy infrastructure is emerging as the defining constraint. AI and data centres require uninterrupted power, resilient backup systems and increasing volumes of cooling capacity, placing significant pressure on electricity networks already operating at their limits.

Nigeria has positioned itself as a key hub in Africa's growing digital economy, attracting a new wave of investment from global technology companies and domestic developers accelerating the construction of high-capacity data centres across major commercial centres. Market forecasts indicate that the country's data-centre sector could expand from just over \$300 million in 2025 to nearly \$800 million by 2031. How best can policymakers, energy leaders and the technology sector effectively and sustainably power future data centres? How can energy sources be diversified to support this?

In an increasingly interconnected energy landscape, evolving global trade dynamics underscore the limitations of relying on traditional energy corridors. As nations adapt their alliances to form new trade partnerships, reduce their vulnerability and improve operational continuity and agility, strategic partnerships are playing a decisive role in shaping national energy security goals.

Forging effective bilateral relationships requires a strategic approach to energy diplomacy. Disparities in energy resources, economic development and geopolitical influences mean that diplomatic frameworks must be tailored to national and regional circumstances while remaining flexible enough to navigate shifting political, market-driven and environmental factors.

15:20 - 15:50 Energy Talk: Redefining the Regional Refining Landscape



Africa produces more than 5 million barrels of crude oil per day yet imports over 70 per cent of its refined petroleum products. With demand set to double by 2050, this structural imbalance has left many economies exposed to price volatility, supply disruptions and foreign exchange pressures. Across West Africa, a new refining wave is emerging, driven by the operationalisation of the Dangote Refinery, the ongoing revamp of state-owned assets and growing interest in modular facilities.

According to the latest 'Foreign Trade in Goods Statistics' released by the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS), crude oil alone accounted for 56.14 per cent of Nigeria's total exports in Q3 2025, underlining the continued centrality of the petroleum sector to foreign exchange earnings and the strategic importance of domestic value addition. Where will the capital for refinery rehabilitation come from? How has increased refining capacity reshaped trade flows? What does the regional outlook look like?

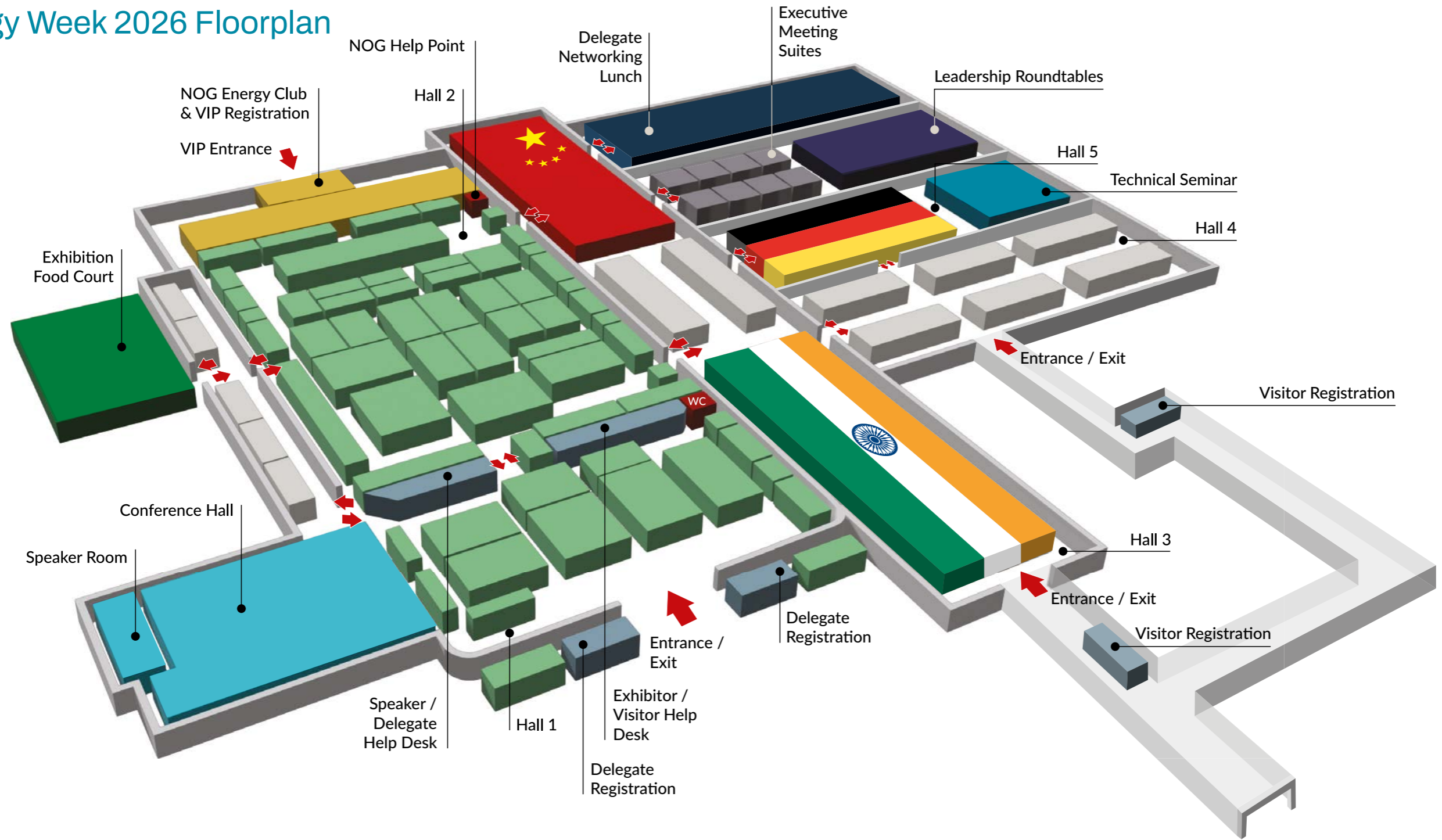
