Strategic Conference Highlights

The NOG Energy Week 2026 Strategic Conference brought together policymakers, industry leaders, investors and technology providers to explore the opportunities and challenges shaping the future of Africa's energy sector. Through a series of high level discussions, delegates examined strategies to strengthen energy security, accelerate investment, unlock financing, advance digital transformation, expand domestic gas utilisation and support a balanced energy transition.

The conference reinforced the importance of collaboration, innovation and enabling policy frameworks in driving sustainable growth across the energy value chain. Discussions also highlighted the role of local content, workforce development and strategic partnerships in positioning Nigeria as a competitive and resilient energy hub.

- Industry leaders reaffirmed the importance of strengthening public private partnerships, improving regulatory certainty and accelerating project delivery to unlock investment opportunities and drive sustainable growth across Nigeria's energy sector.
- Discussions highlighted the transformative role of technology, artificial intelligence and digital innovation in improving operational efficiency, enhancing safety and supporting smarter decision making across the energy value chain.
- Stakeholders emphasised the need to unlock financing, expand domestic gas utilisation and strengthen supporting infrastructure through innovative funding models, coordinated investment and market driven solutions to improve energy access and industrial development.
- The conference also reinforced the importance of balancing energy security with decarbonisation through collaboration, hydrogen development, local content initiatives, workforce capacity building and strategic investments that will support Africa's long term energy future.

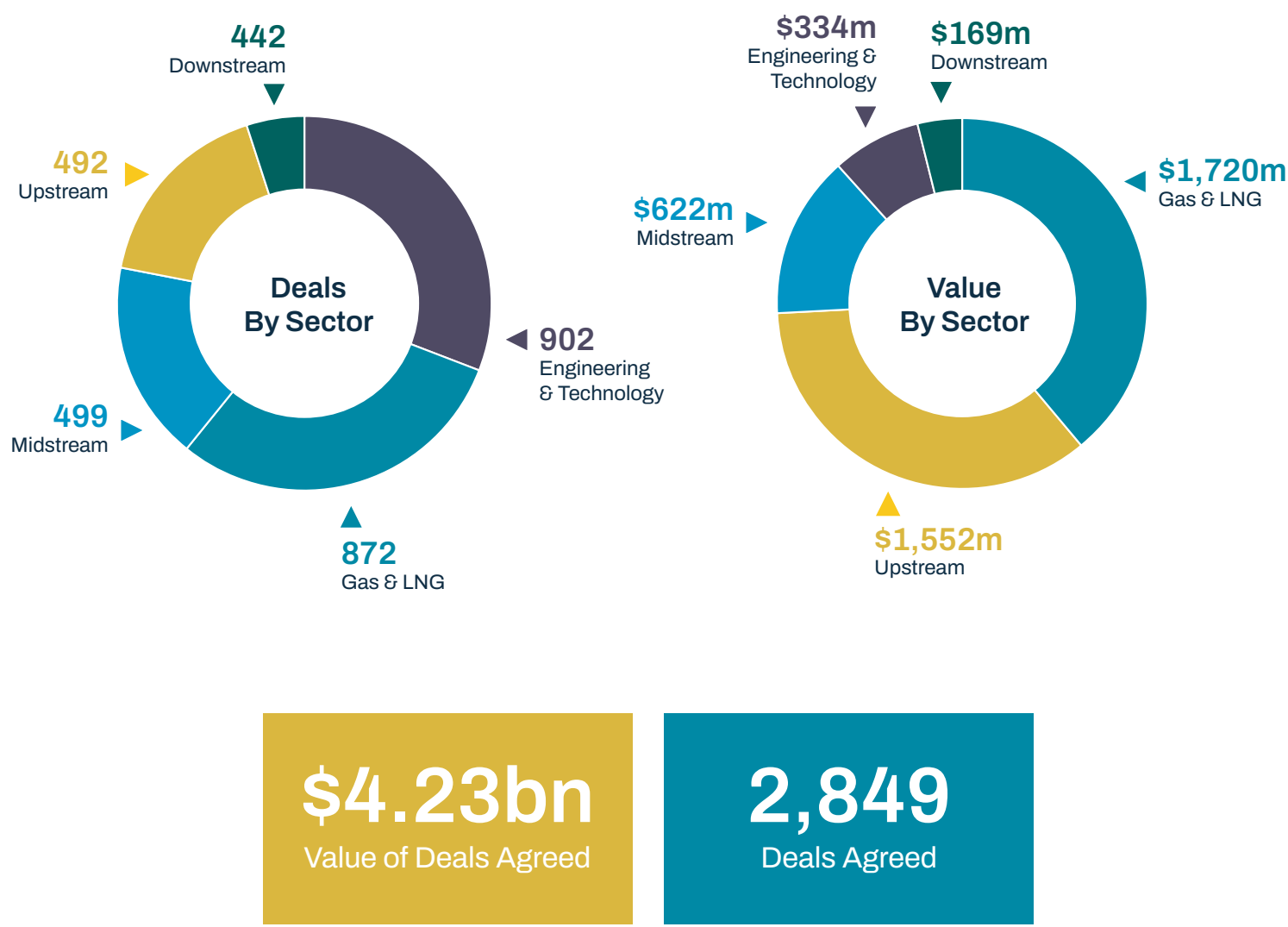


Deals, Announcements & Partnerships

Key Deals & Announcements

- Strategic agreements involving NNPC, NUPRC and the U.S. Trade and Development Agency (USTDA) underscored a shared commitment to strengthening collaboration, attracting investment and accelerating growth across Nigeria's energy sector.
- Major announcements, including ExxonMobil's Usan Infill Project announcement and the launch of the Nigeria Gas & Power Infrastructure Map, reinforced ongoing efforts to support investment, improve industry planning and unlock new opportunities across the energy value chain.
- The Energy Alliance also featured multiple deal announcements, Memoranda of Understanding (MoU) signings, project launches and partnership agreements involving organisations such as Bronon Energy Ltd., Petroli Energy Marketing & Supply Ltd., Sahara Deepwater Resources Ltd. and Tulcan Energy E&P Co. Ltd., demonstrating continued momentum in innovation, collaboration and sector development.
