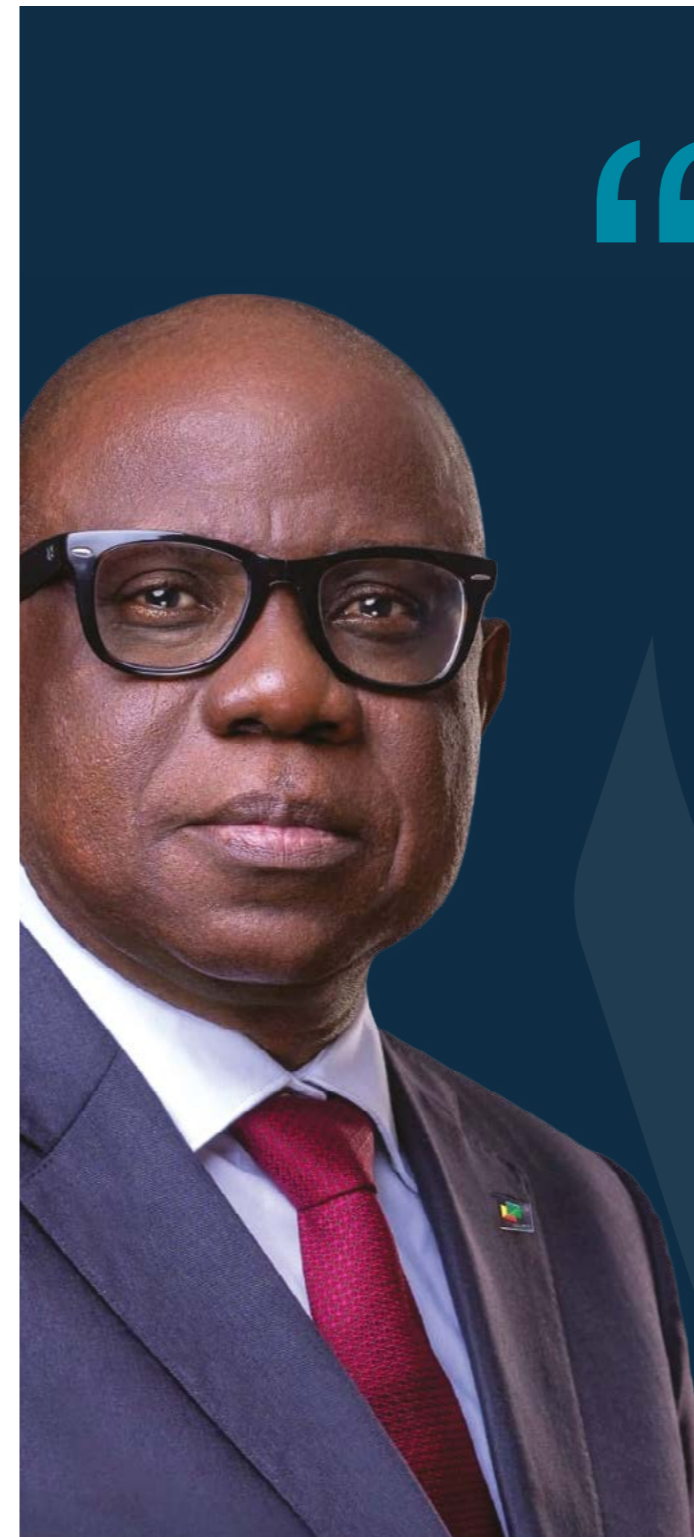

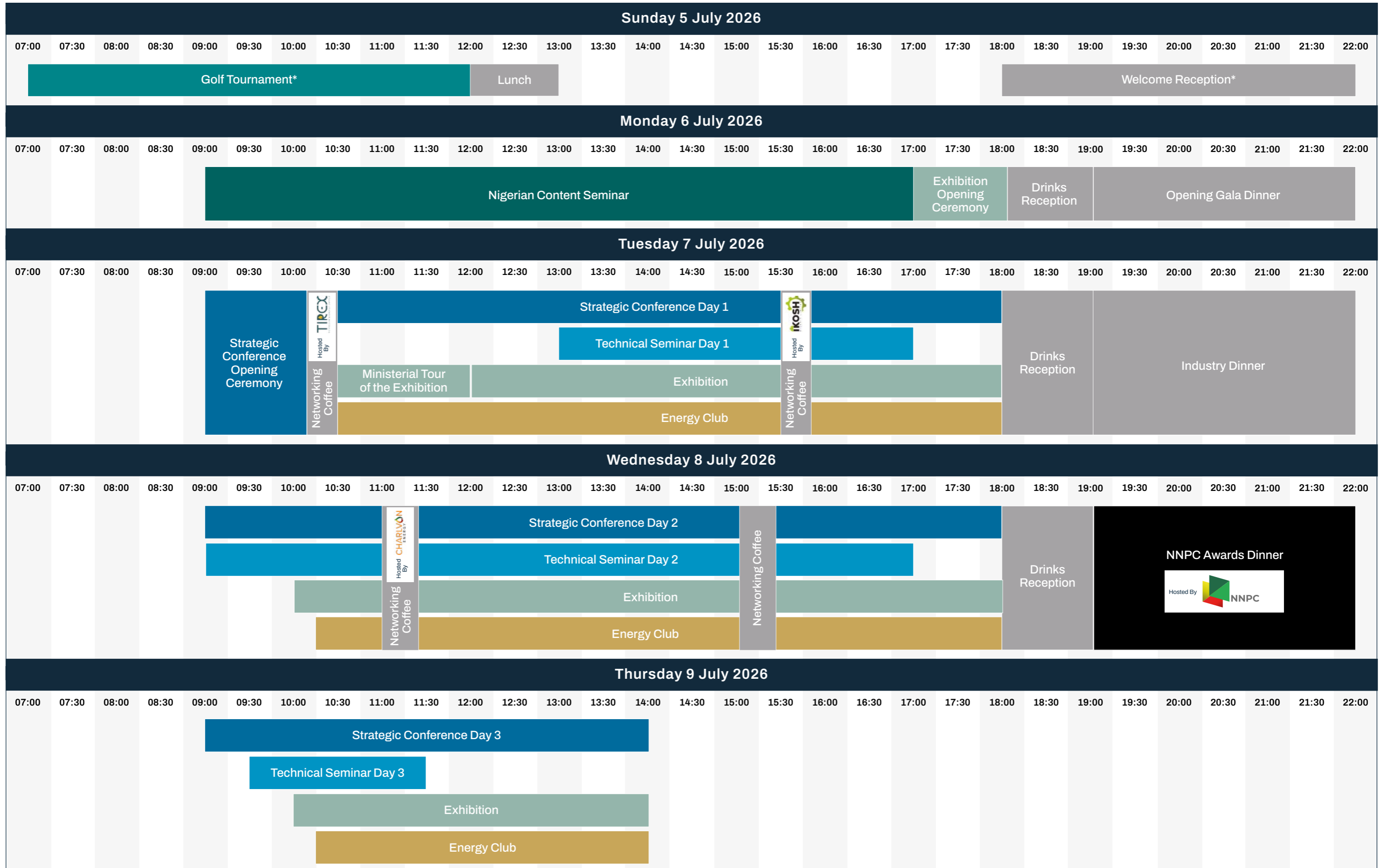

## Nigerian Content Seminar

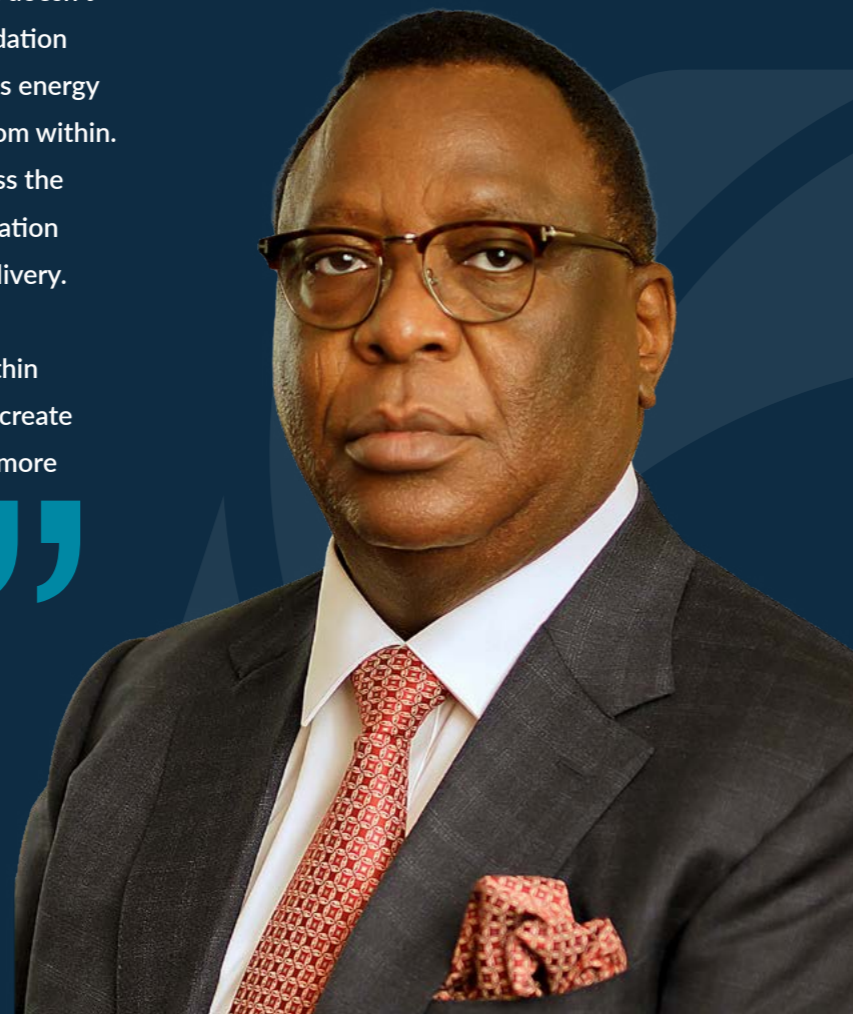

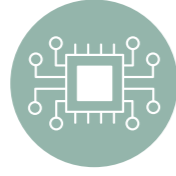

Recent developments across the Middle East and Red Sea have demonstrated how quickly disruptions can reverberate through trade flows and supply security. Therefore, reinforcing the importance of broadening the energy supply base.  As global buyers look to diversify their supply, governments of resource rich regions are repositioning themselves as reliable, competitive and strategic suppliers to key demand centres. What is the optimal policy response at this pivotal moment? How can African nations quickly become critical suppliers to Asia and Europe? As global demand dynamics shift and energy security takes centre stage, strategic projects such as the African Atlantic Gas Pipeline and the Trans-Saharan Gas Pipeline present the opportunity to unlock supply, connect underutilised resources to international demand centres and maximise export opportunities in high value global markets.  What progress has been made across key regional pipeline projects to date? What are the near-term development plans and timelines for delivery? How are governments and partners structuring these projects to ensure commercial viability and long-term sustainability? With refining capacity estimated at 3.5–4.0 million barrels per day (bpd), the addition of the 650,000 bpd Dangote Refinery marks a significant step change, rapidly increasing capacity over the past 12–18 months and opening new trade flows across regional markets, as well as into Europe and the Middle East.  Amidst persistent structural challenges around crude supply, financing and trade inefficiencies, how can regional refining capacity be scaled to enhance global competitiveness, strengthen trading dynamics, improve supply security and sustain investor appetite?  <b>Attendee Insights</b> Understand plans to expand regional refining capacity, strengthen competitiveness, supply security and investment appeal.

15:35 - 16:15 Strategic Panel Session: Unlocking the Next Wave of Upstream Investment Opportunities



A tightening global supply outlook, combined with geopolitical uncertainty, is reinforcing the strategic importance of upstream investment and energy security especially in emerging markets. This is driving a renewed focus on resource-rich markets capable of delivering scalable, long-term supply.

Nigeria's timely licensing rounds targeting over \$10 billion in new investment, are supported by the Petroleum Industry Acts' (PIA) more competitive fiscal frameworks and Presidential Directives aimed at improving cost and time efficiencies. These measures could strengthen Nigeria's hydrocarbons supply base and mitigate the risk of recent geopolitical events.

With Africa's share of global energy investment rising, the opportunity is clear; but sustaining momentum will depend on regulatory certainty, transparent processes and long-term policy consistency.

What role will the bid rounds play in unlocking new capital and accelerating exploration? And how can policy, regulation and market conditions be aligned to strengthen investor confidence and long-term competitiveness?

Africa's offshore energy sector is entering a decisive growth phase, driven by rising global demand, improved deepwater technologies, and a wave of new discoveries across frontier basins.

Countries like Namibia, Senegal, Mozambique, and Angola have collectively attracted more than \$80 billion in upstream investment commitments over the past decade, with deepwater projects accounting for over 60% of new capital expenditure. However, these opportunities are coupled with complex operating environments marked by regulatory fragmentation, infrastructure gaps, geopolitical risk, and evolving energy transition pressures.

What are the key challenges companies face in offshore development today? How can industry stakeholders collaborate more effectively to improve production efficiency and reduce costs in complex field operations? And what technological, capacity and infrastructure gaps must be addressed to unlock the next phase of offshore growth?

11:10 - 11:50 Strategic Panel Session: Production Optimisation Strategies in the New Energy Landscape



Africa's production challenge is unfolding against a complex and rapidly evolving energy backdrop with ramifications stretching from the current geopolitical upheaval in the Middle East. Whilst the continent currently produces approximately 7 - 8% of global production output, it represents a significant, long-term decline from the continent's peak production shares in the early 2000s, highlighting challenges in field productivity, maturing assets and limited investment.

Recent years have seen increased M&A activity and a growing role for indigenous operators in sustaining output from existing fields. However, unlocking the next phase of growth will require a more deliberate alignment of capital allocation, operational strategy and technological integration. As operators seek to maximise recovery and improve asset performance, the focus must shift towards building resilient project pipelines, advancing 'drill-ready' opportunities and strengthening technical capabilities across the value chain.

In an increasingly competitive market, how can operators optimise production from existing assets while positioning for future growth? What role will digitalisation, AI and advanced technologies play in improving efficiency and reducing costs? And how can capital be deployed more effectively to unlock new reserves and sustain long-term production?

The rapid expansion of AI, cloud computing and digital services is driving an unprecedented global surge in data centre development. As governments and technology firms race to secure computing capacity, energy infrastructure is emerging as the defining constraint. AI and data centres require uninterrupted power, resilient backup systems and increasing volumes of cooling capacity, placing significant pressure on electricity networks already operating at their limits.

Nigeria has positioned itself as a key hub in Africa's growing digital economy, attracting a new wave of investment from global technology companies and domestic developers accelerating the construction of high-capacity data centres across major commercial centres. Market forecasts indicate that the country's data-centre sector could expand from just over \$300 million in 2025 to nearly \$800 million by 2031. How best can policymakers, energy leaders and the technology sector effectively and sustainably power future data centres? How can energy sources be diversified to support this?

In an increasingly interconnected energy landscape, evolving global trade dynamics underscore the limitations of relying on traditional energy corridors. As nations adapt their alliances to form new trade partnerships, reduce their vulnerability and improve operational continuity and agility, strategic partnerships are playing a decisive role in shaping national energy security goals.

Forging effective bilateral relationships requires a strategic approach to energy diplomacy. Disparities in energy resources, economic development and geopolitical influences mean that diplomatic frameworks must be tailored to national and regional circumstances while remaining flexible enough to navigate shifting political, market-driven and environmental factors.

As Africa's energy demand continues to rise, natural gas is playing an increasingly critical role in supporting economic development, expanding energy access and enabling industrialisation. Nigeria stands at a defining inflection point in its energy journey.

With 209.26 tcf of proven gas and an upside potential of up to 600 tcf, it possesses one of the most consequential hydrocarbon basins in the world. Combined with bold reforms such as the PIA and the governments long term Gas centric energy transition plan, the nation is uniquely positioned to accelerate sustainable economic growth and global energy leadership. Building on this foundation, the NNPC Gas Master Plan sets forth a commercially driven, execution anchored roadmap to transform Nigeria into a globally competitive gas hub. However, realising this potential will depend on accelerated supply, coordinated investment and strategic infrastructure development to bring gas to market at scale.

14:40 - 15:10 Energy Talks: Accelerating the FLNG Frontier for Supply Security



Floating LNG (FLNG) is rapidly emerging as a key solution for accelerating gas development, enabling producers to monetise offshore resources while reducing exposure to onshore infrastructure, security and permitting risks. As Africa prepares for a significant rise in gas demand, projected to increase by around 60% by 2050, this infrastructure offers a faster and more flexible pathway to global markets.

Across the continent, projects in Mozambique and Congo have demonstrated how FLNG can unlock offshore reserves and fast-track LNG exports. With more than 200 trillion cubic feet of proven gas reserves, Nigeria is well positioned to leverage this model to expand LNG capacity and strengthen its role in global gas markets. Yet despite several proposed projects, progress has been slower than in other African markets. What conditions are required for Nigeria to compete effectively in the FLNG market? And what lessons from existing projects can help unlock Nigeria's abundant offshore gas resources?

09:30 - 10:00 Energy Talks: Unlocking Hydrogen's Economy as a Reliable Energy Transition Fuel



Nigeria is positioning itself as a major African green hydrogen hub, aiming for a \$50 billion export market by 2060 as part of its Net-Zero and Energy Transition Plan. Leveraging high renewable energy potential for green hydrogen and natural gas for blue hydrogen, Nigeria is developing a National Hydrogen Policy with international partnerships to decarbonize industries and produce fertilizer.

As Nigeria and other countries in Africa finalise or kick off their hydrogen strategies, the government and stakeholders are actively looking to leverage the existing and expanding Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) infrastructure, in conjunction with CCS to produce and export blue hydrogen as part of a broader energy diversification strategy. While installed generation capacity exceeding 13,000 MW, actual daily output typically falls far below that, leaving households and businesses heavily reliant on diesel generation. With growing energy demand and expanding industrial requirements, ensuring reliable and sustainable power systems are essential.

African nations are betting on solar to meet power generation demand to replace oil in the current markets while prioritising gas for export markets, however with electricity supply coming from gas-fired plants and the critical need to build resilience into the energy systems cross Africa, many countries are currently looking at the power markets and the case for renewables as well as fuel switching to more sustainable and efficient fuels. What structural reforms are required to improve the efficiency and transparency of the power sector? What investment and governance models can unlock sustainable development?

According to Reuters large-scale offshore exploration in West and Southern Africa has driven new discoveries representing around 11% of global finds since 2020, reinforcing the continent's role as a frontier basin for deepwater oil and gas development.

Unlocking the existing opportunities will depend on a strategic, portfolio-wide approach that integrates long-range resource planning, enhanced subsurface insight, and optimal use and development of offshore existing infrastructure and export routes. Africa's offshore projects grounded in this alignment will be best positioned to influence the continent's evolving strategic landscape in the years ahead.

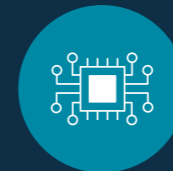

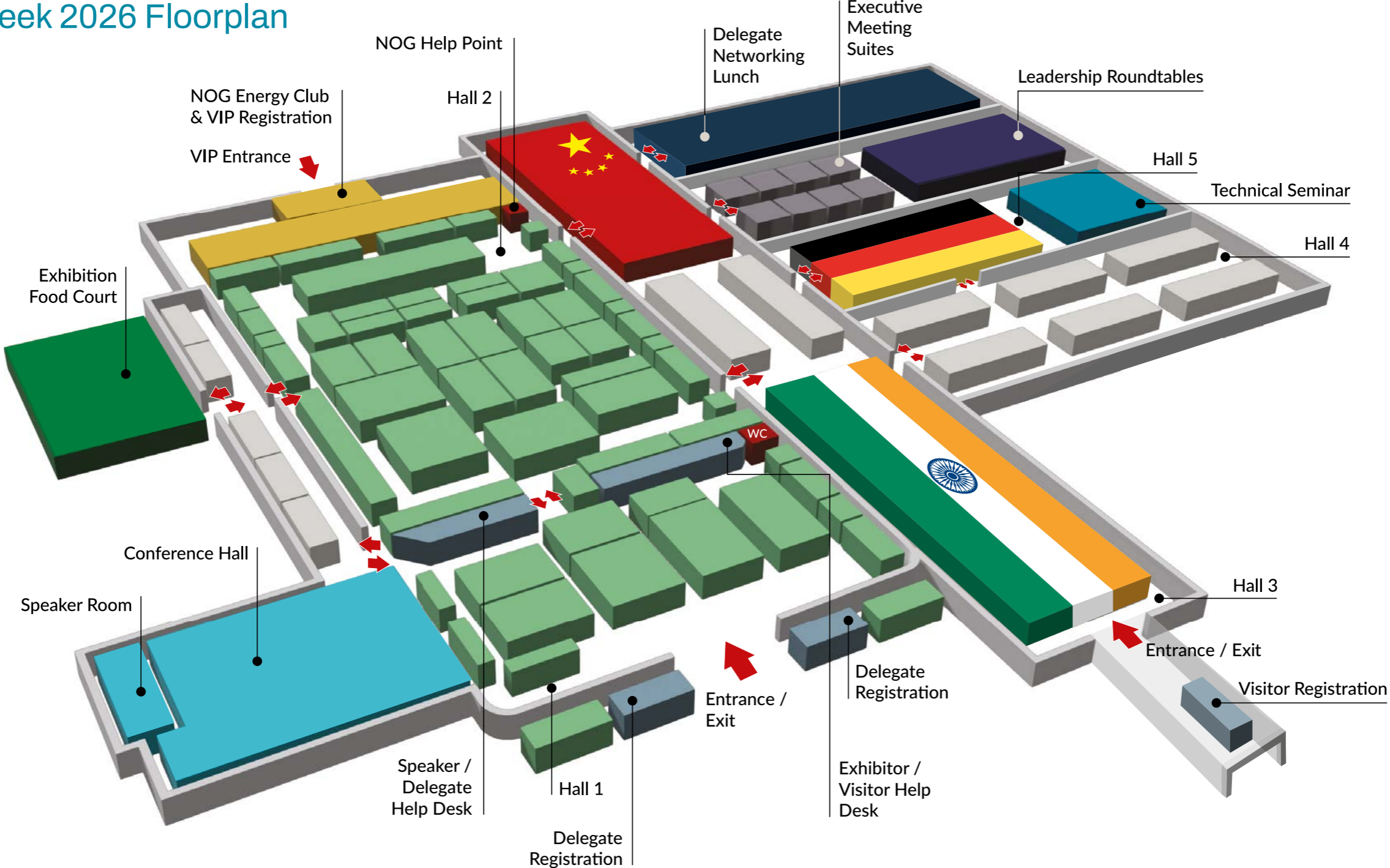
